



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. How many days do I need to explore the park?

Tagua Tagua Park can be visited in a minimum of 4 hours, but a stay of at least 3 days and 2 nights is recommended to fully enjoy and explore the park.

2. Is the park open year-round or only in summer?

The park is open year-round. It can be visited with prior reservation and according to availability, as only 42 people can enter the park daily.

3. Is the park suitable for everyone?

Tagua Tagua Park is accessible to all visitors. However, since it is a mountain park with a 700 m elevation change, good physical condition is required, as some sections present technical challenges and different types of terrain (rocks, streams, roots, etc.).

4. Can I bring children?

Yes, children are welcome. However, due to the mountainous terrain, it may not be suitable for all children. For children aged 0 to 3 years, it is recommended to carry a special backpack. Children aged 4 to 9 must be under strict parental supervision.

5. What is the weather like in the park?

Tagua Tagua Park is located in the Green Patagonia, a region known for its unstable weather. It is advisable to check the weather conditions before visiting the park using the website www.yr.no with the location "Lago Tagua Tagua."

6. What facilities and trails does the park have?

The park features an Information Center at the entrance, a storage facility for basic belongings, two shelters, restrooms, showers, and a network of trails covering a total of 24 kilometers. The trails include a main trail and several secondary trails leading to natural attractions such as the suspension bridge over the Tagua-Tagua waterfall, waterfalls, lagoons, and viewpoints. These trails can be explored with an expert guide or on a self-guided visit.

7. Do the shelters have showers, hot water, and electricity?

The shelters are rustic and designed for sleeping in sleeping bags. They have basic electricity for charging phones, a wood stove, a first-aid kit, mats, and an outdoor bathroom. None of the shelters have hot water; only cold water is available in winter and summer. Additionally, the Quetrus shelter does not have a shower.

8. Is there mobile phone signal or internet coverage in the park?

No, there is no mobile phone signal or internet coverage in the park. However, each shelter is equipped with a UHV radio connected to the ranger's radio and Mítico Puelo Lodge for emergencies.

9. Is it possible to leave some equipment in custody?

Yes, it is possible to leave equipment in custody at the park, although food and valuables cannot be left. Please consult with the ranger upon your arrival for more details.
